TEACHER RESOURCE

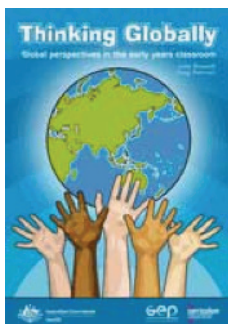
An excellent teacher resource that provides a detailed description of teaching with a global perspective, and six chapters of cross-curricula activities. Chapters explore the concepts of linking with others, personal identity, dimensions of change, social justice, rights, and sustainable futures through activities that use three levels of thinking, based on an inquiry approach.

The book is accompanied by a CD-ROM of materials to support teachers. It includes a collection of photographs, digital resources with related teaching activities, templates, an annotated list of picture storybooks and a video modelling good global education in the classroom.

Inquiry sequences include:

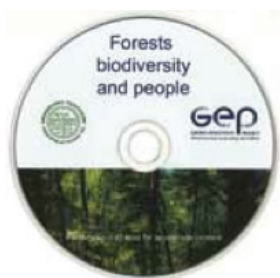
- Where are the world's forests? How has their distribution changed over time?

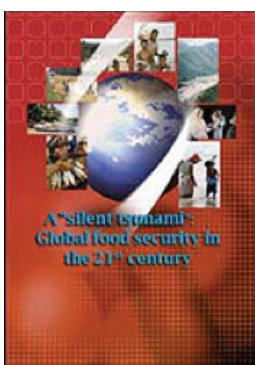
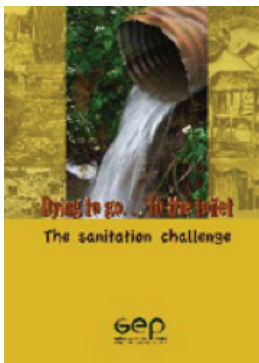
- Global food security – what is the issue?
